





MEET THE NOMINATED GOVERNORS







APPROVAL OF NEW STATUTES AND RATIFICATION OF NEW BY-LAWS

Approval of New Statutes and ratification of new By-Laws

A working committee, chaired by Legal Advisor Sandra van Essche, has updated the Club's Statutes and By-Laws, which were outdated.

The proposed Statutes and By-Laws were presented to, and approved by the 2018 Board of Governors, on December 10th 2018.

Members at the AGM will now be asked to approve the new Statutes and ratify the new By-Laws.

The vote will be by raise of hands.



STATUTES: Foundation of the Organisation - Subject to French law, Loi de 1901. Statutes had not been overhauled since 1964 other than a small change in 2015.

Conditions to an association under this law are:

it must be comprised of at least two people;

it must have an object other than sharing the assets -- it may not enrich one or more of its members.

In order to have a legal identity, the association must file its statutes with the local Prefecture (Grasse for the ACR). The association must have a legal representative and be managed (by its Board of Governors).

Statutes cover various organizational topics such as:

OBJECT:

To cultivate professional, social and cultural relationships among Americans, French and other nationals living on or visiting the French Riviera.

To preserve and share traditions, language and culture and to promote a continuing exchange of friendship and understanding between organizations of public interest with similar goals or purposes and members of the Club.

To honor the French Riviera communities by using local resources and supporting local businesses.

To promote goodwill, understanding, mutual respect and cooperation between the citizens of the United States and France.

MEMBERS: Active and Honorary

DUES: Initiation Fee and Dues - Proposed by Board and ratified by Members

BOARD of GOVERNORS: Composed of Officers + at least 3 active members – no more than 13), Serve for 1 year, renewable upon certain conditions.

OFFICERS: President, Vice President(s), Secretary, Treasurer.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING: Majority of votes present required to act.

RESOURCES: Dues, fees, contributions, subsidies.

COMPENSATION: None. Reimbursement of expenses.

BY-LAWS: Internal regulations.

DISSOLUTION: Assets must be distributed for exempt purposes only.



BY-LAWS - Internal Rules and Regulations. May be amended from time to time. Topics addressed:

MEMBERSHIP: Eligibility, Type, Duration, Dues, Fees, Rights and Responsibilities of Members, Resignation and Termination.

MEETINGS OF MEMBERS: Annual, Special/ Extraordinary, Notices, Quorum (20% of Active Members), Voting procedures.

BOARD OF GOVERNORS: Responsible for management of Club. Officers run day to day affairs. Committees permitted. No less than 3 – no more than 13, Regular meetings, Special meetings, Notice, Quorum (majority required).

OFFICERS: President, VP(s), Sec, Treas. By-Laws spell out responsibilities. Legal Advisor. Elected at Annual Meeting. One year terms, renewable if approved by 75% of Governors.

CONTRACTS: Club contracts to be approved by President and Treasurer or delegates. Checks and other financial instruments signed by officer appointed by Board of Governors. No loans.

OTHER: Various policies: Books and records, Conflict of interest, Nondiscrimination, Data Protection, Amendments by majority of Board of Governors and ratified by Members.

Members at the AGM will now be asked to approve the new Statutes and ratify the new By-Laws.

The vote will be by raise of hands.



RATIFICATION OF MEMBERSHIP DUES AND INITIATION FEE

We are pleased to inform you that the Board of Governors has recommended that the Club initiation fee and membership dues remain the same in 2019 as in 2018 at:

€ 40 for singles and € 75 for couples with the initiation fee unchanged at € 15 per person.

In accordance with the Statutes, members will be asked to ratify the dues and fees for 2019.

Membership payment is due promptly at the beginning of the year and no later than April 1st. We do not offer half-year membership.

Members at the AGM are now asked to ratify the dues and fees for 2019 by raise of hands.
